

Included with the attached Financial Statements are the following detailed statements:


In 2018-2019 the Regina Engineering Society (RES) realized a net profit of \$ 1902.75 based on income of \$27,860.00 and expenses of \$ 25,957.25. 74% of the RES revenue (\$20,975) is provided through a member grant from the Association of Professional Engineers and Geoscientists of Saskatchewan (APEGS) and the RES is indebted to APEGS for this financial contribution. The Horizon's Dinner (15%), the Annual Golf Tournament (10%) and the investment of interest-mortgage fund (1%) contribute the remainder of the income.

RES fees are collected and distributed by the Association of Professional Engineers and Geoscientists of Saskatchewan in the form of a yearly grant. The grant is based on the number of Professional Engineers (\$10.00) and Engineers-In-Training (\$5.00) located in Regina and surrounding communities. Grant disbursements are made annually on the calendar year after the RES Annual Meeting.





The RES balances its expenditures through select contributions to supporting higher education through awards and scholarships (21%), the keystone Horizon's Dinner (23%), the IMAX Day (9%), the Annual Golf Tournament (15%) and all the other Social Programs including the Meet the Executive (21%),. Operating expenses account for 11% of the RES expenditures.
